Story of Impact: Snapshot of our work (Fargo, North Dakota)

Since the 1980's, the Sisters' Peace and Justice Office in Fargo, North Dakota, USA, has been addressing a range of social justice issues for Indigenous peoples. These include working for the provision of better health care, networking to establish a social detox centre, supporting a protest movement against the Dakota Access Oil Pipeline which threatened Indian reservations, and getting involved with a collaborative annual event where local justice and peace groups collaborate and share concerns.
