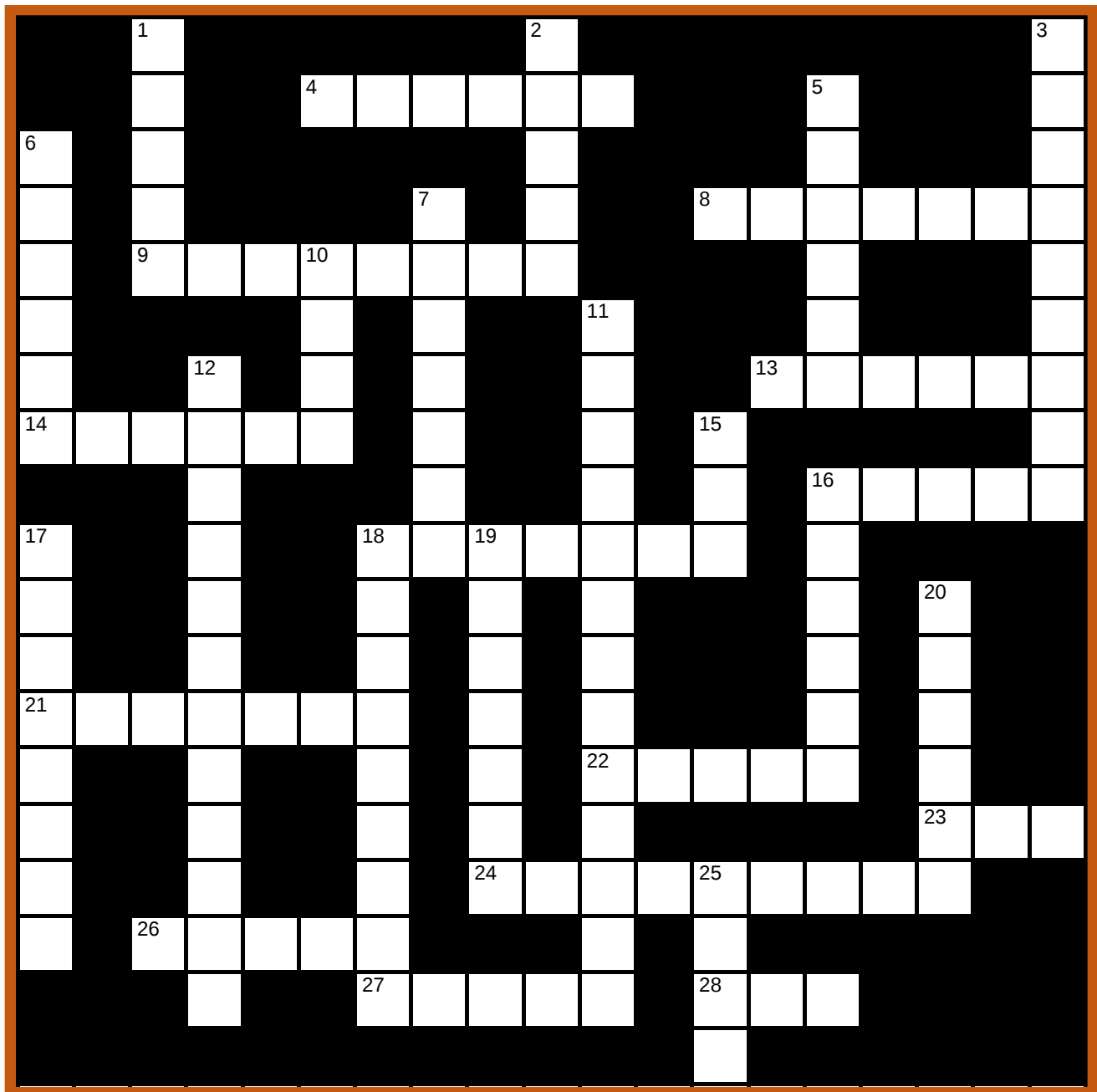


Nano Nagle Icon

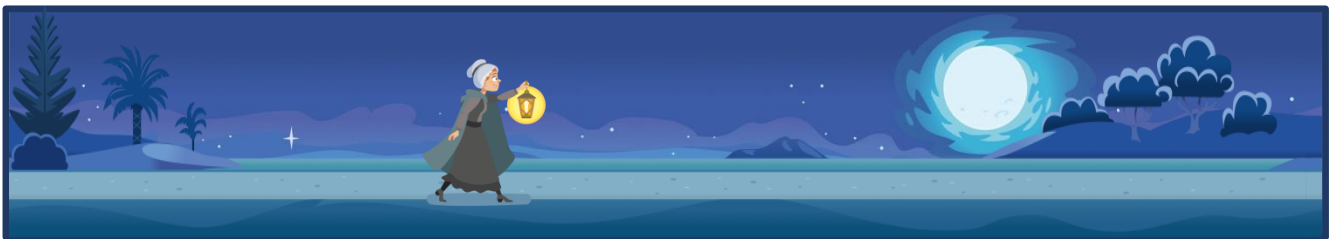
