Preface

In the days of the Celts, Northern Europe was covered with forests so thick it was said, that a squirrel could hop from branch to branch, from one end to the other, without touching the ground. When a tribe cleared the land for a settlement, they always left a great tree in the middle, known in Ireland as the "Crann Bethadh," or "Tree of Life" that embodied the security and integrity of the people.

The ecology and theological metaphor of trees and water remains present in many global religious traditions. 


Our Christian Brothers Schools' Heritage Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA)




