Arc Nano Nagle Day



Rationale

This year, our Nano Nagle Celebrations are focused on 'Hands' in line with the staff Spirituality focus. We are also focusing on the meaning behind the Nano icon and 3D storytelling as a way of letting our students learn more about how hands can be used creatively to tell the Nano story through art and dramatisation.

The day will commence with Mass where our Mary statue will be blessed. As the students leave mass, they will each be given an empty bag. However, as they journey through the stations they will receive a take away/memento from each station that they will add to their bag. By the end of the day, each student will have a small show bag with memories of their 2019 Nano Nagle Day.

Following mass, we will break into classes and move around the school 'Walking our Way with Nano for 2019.' Each class will move around each station through rotations. Each class from Kindergarten to Year 3 will also have 4 allocated Year 6 helpers with them for the day. Some activities will be class teacher led while others will have a leader or facilitator to lead them.

Activity Stations for the Rotations

Station 1 - Jesuit Bag Drop

Location: Primary Playground Facilitator: Class Teacher Only

Show Bag Item: Hand



During this station, students will reflect and share their memories of David's Visit to Haberfield. Teacher will lead a discussion about other ways students can use their hands to help others. Students will then be asked to write or draw (on the hand) how they can continue to use their hands to help others who are less fortunate. How can we live out Nano's three values of SIMPLICITY, COMPASSION and HOSPITALITY?

Students add these hands to their bag to take home as a reminder of how as Catholics through our Baptism we are ALL called to serve and be the 'Face of Christ' to all who we meet - just like Nano.

Station 2 - The Lady of the Lantern

Location: Infants Facilitator: Ms Makin

Show Bag Item: Lyrics to 'The Lady of the Lantern'

During this station, students will listen to and learn the new Nano Nagle song. The song is recorded on a CD which will be in a CD player. Please take the time to listen and have a go at singing this song with your students. Students will receive a copy of the lyrics to this song that they can take home with them.



Station 3 - Lantern Making

Location: Gadigal

Facilitator: Mr Luff and Year 6 Helpers (with class teacher)

Show Bag Item: Lantern

During this station, students will make their own lantern in memory of Nano so that they may go home and keep the light burning.



Station 4 - Presentation People Today!

Location: Drama Room

Show Bag Item: World Map

During this station, students will learn about the many Presentation People that are hard at work all over the world. Students will understand how together, we are a Presentation Family, keeping

the legacy of Nano Nagle alive. At the end of this station, students will be able to take home a world map of the *Presentation Family*.

Station 5 - Praying the Rosary

Location: Nagle Garden

Facilitator: Signora and Class Teacher Show Bag Item: Coloured Rosary Beads

Station 6 - Nano Nagle - The Story (3D Storytelling)

Location: Library

Facilitator: Class Teacher Only Show Bag Item: Nano (on a stick)

Storytelling is part of the way we teach Religious Education. Today, look, listen and understand Nano through the art of 3D Storytelling, led by Mrs Gray. Students will be able to take home their own Nano figure to keep the story alive.

Station 7 - The Nano Icon

Location: Hall #1

Show Bag Item: Icon

The Nano Nagle Icon is a very significant artwork that depicts not only Nano Nagle herself but is a jigsaw of her life. During this station, students will unpack the detail and story within this icon.

Show Bag Item: Infants - Artwork Primary - NA

After having listened to the information and detail about The Nano Nagle Icon, students will then have a chance to explore it further.
