Challenging the brutal power of her people's oppression, she spent her life on the "razor's edge of danger"




A Leader is anyone who takes responsibility for finding the potential in people and processes, and who has the courage to develop that potential.

Transformational leadership - makes connections with others to transform a situation of common concern.


Servant leadership — focuses on leaders

Heart -Compassion



Heart Leadership places us at the centre of relational life.

We are born to love. We are born to be loved. Nano had great devotion to the humanity of Jesus, the icon of God's compassion, traditionally expressed through devotion to the Sacred Heart.

Nano's devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus was the source of her fidelity to her mission.

Her compassion, revealed in her initiatives to serve the poor, emerged from the heart space. Her intuitive connection with the heart as the space from which life is empowered and directed captures an ancient wisdom.

Nano's ministry to Cork's poor came from the heart and spoke directly to the hearts of those she helped. Leaders are called to do the same, to lead with the heart—with kindness, love, mercy and forgiveness.

The energy of the heart, cultivated in love and compassion, will resource a Leader with resilience in the face of an array of difficulties

Like Jesus, the icon of God's compassionate love, Nano came to embody God's compassionate presence for those pushed to the edges of Cork's society.

Nano's zeal and sheer hard work over so many years in such difficult circumstances arose from her closeness to the Heart of Jesus and her fidelity to the Gospel message to spread the Good News of God's love to those who are poor.

For Nano, wisdom came for contemplation and the ability to discern the best way forward. She also sought advice from others—her Uncle Joseph, Teresa Mulally, Father Moylan ... Nano was also open to the wisdom of the streets, attentive to the light and darkness of her experiences ...

Nano Nagle had an experience early in her innovative enterprise of just how destructive an unwise word could be, so she kept secret her plans to open a school until such time as she felt she could bring her brother and sister-in-law round to the idea.

As a wise woman, Nano knew when to talk and when to keep silent.

It is one of the arts of leadership to know when to talk and when to keep silent, even if it might be difficult to do so.

All leaders must choose their words carefully, picking the right time to speak, so that their words can have the best impact.

This was a leadership skill which Nano Nagle had internalized, even at a time when leadership science was unknown.

Creativity involves the focusing of energy, the engagement of the circumstances of life, committing and moving forward despite odds and uncertainty. (Tobin Hart).




Her creative legacy was born from long periods of insecurity and uncertainty.

Nano's life is a study of creativity, a journey of change, challenge, loss, financial insecurity, change of direction, anxious decisions and struggle.

Her leadership surmounted these challenges, forging a new path and a new approach to the poverty which surrounded her.


It was not an easy journey and there were times when her energies flagged but she was always flexible and creative in her response to the difficulties she met.



Inability to engage change emerged as one of the primary causes for projects floundering.

Time and time again, highly competent and successful individuals, persons with excellent education and strong skill sets get on the wrong path because they stubbornly refuse to adapt to the changing demands of the moment.

Rather than spending a reasonable amount of time proactively acknowledging and addressing the fears and feelings that show up during change and upheaval, we spend an unreasonable amount of time managing problematic behaviors. (Brene Brown)



The ability to take the untrodden path, creatively, and to imagine a future not yet born, without seeking to rush such a birth, were critical to the quality of lived leadership which is manifested in the life of Nano Nagle.




