


Garden of Peace Isaiah 32:14-18

theme selected by Pope Francis for the day as "Seeds of **Peace and Hope" -** so appropriate for us pilgrims in this Jubilee Year of Hope. The theme conjures up the image of people moving through the world in their daily lives while sowing seeds of respect, goodness and kindness for ALL of life, natural and human, at the same time being converted into seeds themselves, seeds that nurture peace and justice in every situation encountered in order to transform the hate and violence besieging the planet and its residents.

In his encyclical **Fratelli Tutti**, Pope Francis pursued this vision of a radically different societal, economic, and politi-

cal order. While progress may seem illusive, there are beautiful projects taking root to restore the earth. Even very young inventors are creating solutions to compensate for lack of resources in the most desperate of circumstances. Courageous people on opposite sides of warring groups are building bridges of healing reconciliation. (Click on the IPA logo.) This kind of news does indeed spark hope in our day, just as Nano's lantern must have been a beacon of hope in Cork alleyways. Some groups have designed specific Pilgrimages of Hope for Creation, which encapsulate our three Core Values. #### Covenant with Creation

A Covenant is a sacred relationship between two partners, making a binding promise to each other to work together for a common goal. Covenant defines obligations and commitments.

"So God created humankind in his image. He blessed them and said be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and have a domain over every living thing that moves upon earth......every tree with seeds in fruit... Everything that has the breath of life..." (Genesis 1:27-31)

#### Thus God entrusted them with the responsibility to care for and manage it wisely.

God also entered into Covenant with Abraham: "You shall be the ancestor of multitude of nations" (Gen. 17:4) and with Noah: "water shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh". (Gen. 9:4)

Jesus made a new covenant: "He took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them saying this is my body which is given for you, do this in remembrance of me.......This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood". (Luke 22:19-20)

From the time when God and Adam entered into a covenant, humankind has been entrusted with the responsibility of taking care of and managing Earth. But what we do? In the name of development we destroy our environment and culture in the name of civilization.

But our Creator expects us:

- To appreciate the wonders of creation, take care of earth and manage the earth responsibly as stewards of creation by adopting sustainable practices, by reducing waste and preserving nature.
- The covenant also emphasizes the need to take care of the vulnerable (including the poor) and living with love, compassion and justice to fulfil our role within God's Divine creation.

Of our three Core Values, I am of the opinion that

## "Nano's Hot Meals Opens to Serve Philippine Typhoon Victims"

In response to the devastating impact of Typhoon Crising (Wipha), Binalbagan Catholic College, Inc. (BCC) launched a community-driven relief initiative dubbed "Nano's Hot Meals". As torrential rains and strong winds, brought by the typhoon, disrupted lives across Negros Island, BCC mobilized its





faculty, students, and volunteers to provide immediate support to affected families. Nano's Hot Meals, named in honor of Venerable Nano Nagle, the College's patron of compassion and service, began operations by serving hot meals and essential supplies to evacuees and residents in severely affected areas.

True to the mission of service rooted in faith, Nano's Hot Meals is a way of showing that the BCC community stands with those

who are suffering, that even a simple meal can bring warmth, dignity, and a reminder that our brothers and sisters affected by flood are not alone. The college continued expanding its operations to reach more barangays hit by the storm. Community members and partner organizations were encour-

aged to support the cause through contributions of food, hygiene kits, and other basic necessities. These articles have been edited to give the essence of what we as Friends of Nano are endeavouring to achieve by our humble efforts.

Blood Donation Camp Organized by "Friends of Nano". In a significant humanitarian effort, Friends of Nano, Srinagar, partnered with Lal Ded Hospital to organize a blood donation camp, aiming to support local healthcare and encourage voluntary donations. Many participated in this life-saving initiative, including Mary Jarsi PBVM, principal of Presentation Convent High School (PCHSS), who emphasised the

profound impact of blood donation: "There is no greater service than saving a life. A few minutes of our time today can make the difference between hope and despair for someone in need." FON helped with donor registration, provided refreshments and post donation care. Mrs Rubiya, a Senior FON commented, "We believe in service beyond ourselves, Every drop of blood donated today represents a promise to stand by our community in times of need." May Love be our Lantern Flame. As part of their community service and educational outreach program, students from (PCHSS) visited the Voluntary Medicare Society (VMS). Friends of Nano have played a key role in introducing students to the societal impact of disability support services, reinforcing the importance of inclusivity. The main objectives of the visit: to understand the role of VMS in providing rehabilitation, healthcare, and education to underprivileged and differently-

abled individuals; to engage in interactive sessions with patients/special students and staff; to learn about the challenges faced by individuals with disabilities; to raise awareness about inclusivity and social responsibility among students; to provide essential stationery kits to support the educational needs of special students at VMS. "Witnessing their resilience in the face of such hardship has humbled us and reminded us of the true value of compassion and connection. We are proud of being Friends of Nano." In a heartwarming gesture of community service, Friends of Nano, Srinagar, donated a generous supply of food items to Kashmir Youth Campaign Old Age Home, a local non-governmental organisation (NGO), dedicated to serve the elderly/homeless. This initiative brought smiles to the faces of over 30 elderly residents. FON team members delivered the items and spent time interacting with the residents, who expressed their appreciation. ## Friends of Nano in Pakistan commemorate the Feast of the Sacred Heart and the Holy Spirit

The gathering of the **Friends of Nano** in June began in prayer invoking divine love and mercy followed by a reflection on the Holy Spirit and a reading from *One Step Beyond* highlighting Nano's dedication to the Sacred Heart. Sr. Gretta and Nisha challenged the participants to reflect on the needs they observe around them and ways to meaningfully involve others in **FON** initiatives.

In small groups, **FON** engaged in thoughtful reflection on the love of the Sacred Heart in their lives, the calling of the Holy Spirit, and practical ideas for spreading Nano's light to ensure the movement remains vibrant and responsive

to current realities in Pakistan.
Discussions were rich in insight,
grounded in faith, and filled with a
shared desire to serve. Members
exchanged experiences and hopes,
truly embodying Nano's motto:

#### "Deeds not words".

Another prayer and reflection led to a profound moment of silent gratitude and presence, followed by a hymn to the Sacred Heart. The gathering concluded with a collective re-commitment to live out Nano's vision in daily life.



Members expressed a renewed spiritual zeal to continue as light-bearers in their communities.

### FROM the ARCHIVES: Awakening to the Mystery of God, the Mystery of Life.

In June 2011 twenty-four Friends of Nano/Presentation Associates travelled to Ballygriffin for an International Gathering. We arrived as strangers from the corners of the Globe: with our individual dreams and aspirations.

Through the liturgies and our stories and discussions we explored, with the help of each facilitator, the spirituality of Nano: the charism of Nano. One whole day was guided by Fr Jerry, a Jesuit priest from India, as we were led from Nano's birthplace to her Baptismal font (in the local Church) and then travelled into Cork itself. Here we walked in Nano's footsteps from 'South Pres' Convent across the River Lee and past some of the tiny lanes and back streets and 'her schools'. The day was marked by Stations of Prayer and the Eucharist. We glimpsed the Penal Times by visiting a Mass Rock (a hidden spot where Catholics would gather for Mass when it was against the law).



There was much to reflect on as we considered where Nano's heart was leading us - what difference would we make by 'being in communion' as Friends of Nano? Each small step leads to a Movement... One such step was Nano's decision to form a Congregation so that her schools would have a future... 250 years ago - A Jubilee we will

celebrate!



On our final day we celebrated a feast close to Nano's Heart: The Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our Core Values - Passion for the Poorest. Partnership with the Divine, and Covenant with Creation - emerged from the gathered wisdom. These guiding principles would inform our work and our development as a movement. We endeavour to give practical expression to these core values in light of

the charism of Nano through compassion for those most in need, commitment to our aims, persevering with our work, courage in the face of setbacks and difficulties, confidence in Divine providence, creativity in entering an

uncharted course and devising innovative solutions, and in communion with our fellow Friends of Nano and others - all which are underpinned by the practice of **contemplation**. Filled with the Spirit we were 'set loose' singing: "Love shall be your lantern flame, guiding you beyond the known!"
