Ireland she saw the misery and poverty of her own people, and she could not ignore their cries.

Highly discerning the need for Catholic education, Nani defied the law and set up her first school in 1784. Within ten years, she had seven schools throughout Cork.

In 1785, she and three other women founded the Presentation Sisters' religious order and in 1773, she and three other women were professed in 1777 and received the "Sacred Heart" Approval for this religious order. In 1805, after Nani's death, it was given the name Blessed Virgin Mary (BVM).

Her struggle to provide Catholic education for the sick, the lame and the dying.

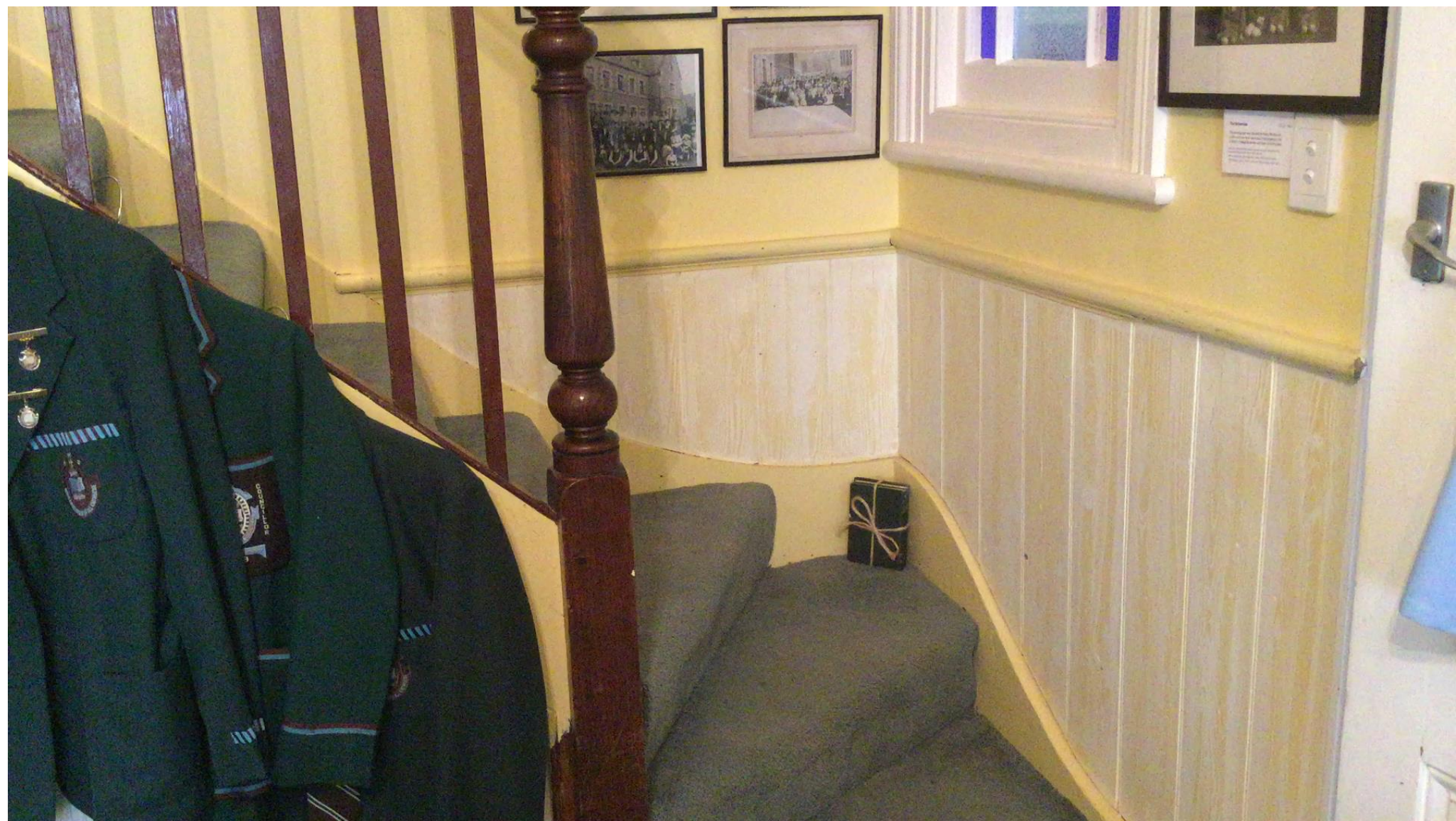
For gentlemen who found her flickering light of her poor attic or hotel in Cork that was the touch of Nani's hand.

Mother Xavier Murphy agreed at once to prepare a group of women to travel to the far South, and to establish a Presentation School in Hobart. It would be the first foundation out of Ireland from the Fermoy convent and the beginning of the remarkable Presentation story in Australia.
